Guided by specially trained staff, Horizon Academy summer students engage as learners in small group, multi-sensory lessons and activities in the Orton-Gillingham approach to reading, written expression, math (using the Math-U-See approach and multi-sensory math), art, music, and PE. The curriculum is adapted to meet the needs of each student to ensure that s/he experiences school success. Orton-Gillingham Tutoring

Horizon Academy is offering one-on-one tutoring sessions throughout the summer using the Orton-Gillingham approach. Orton-Gillingham is an instructional approach intended primarily for use with persons who have difficulty with reading, spelling, and writing of the sort associated with dyslexia and other language-based learning disabilities. This multi-sensory approach is diagnostic, prescriptive, systematic, structured and personalized to meet the needs of the learner. Orton-Gillingham recommends sessions to be a minimum of twice a week for one hour.

****Testing documentation with specific learning disability in reading and writing or dyslexia diagnosis is required****

Supportive Tutoring

Horizon Academy offers on-site one-on-one tutoring sessions providing support to meet the academic demands of a traditional classroom such as:

- **Math-** Whether your student is struggling in Geometry, Algebra, or just basic math skills, we can provide support. Our tutors use multi-sensory math and the Math-U-See approach, a student-paced, mastery-based curriculum that is suitable for students with a wide range of abilities, from gifted to those with learning disabilities.
- **Written Expression-** Improve writing skills through research-based and multi-sensory writing strategies. The sequence of the writing process and 6-traits, will be addressed. Increase writing skill competency to meet the demands of middle and high school curriculum. Students will learn the essential structure and vocabulary of essay writing from prewriting to polishing.
- **Executive Function-** Learn essential study skills such as planning, prioritizing and organizing.

Horizon Academy's July Program will provide academic support for students who need assistance in reading, writing, math, and study skills.

- **Reading**-Improve word decoding, through structured literacy approach, fluency, and/or comprehension through direct instruction of evidence-based reading strategies.
- **Writing**- Depending on student need, improve writing skills, from basic sentence and paragraph writing to the essential structure and vocabulary of essay writing from prewriting to polishing.
- **Math**- Build and maintain math skills from the basics, such as number sense, place value, math facts and problem solving, to more advanced skills such as Algebra, depending on student needs.
- **Study Skills**- Learn important study skills including note taking, strategic learning, time management, and organization.

Classes will be formed based on student's grade and level of academic need.

Light Up Literacy-45 minutes

Light Up Literacy is a research-based, small group instruction related to early reading skills. It is based on the Rhyming to Reading curriculum, where children are directly and explicitly taught skills related to sounds, letters, and rhyming.

Structured Snack Time-15 minutes

As students transition from literacy to numeracy, we will take a brief break with a provided snack and structured story time.

Number Sense-30 minutes

Numeracy, like literacy, is key for students to access and make sense of their world. In this group, children will learn the basic foundations of math. Whether it's teaching, reteaching or reinforcing, students will explore the knowledge and nature of numbers across curriculum and creating meaningful numeracy experiences.
