Mondays (7 meetings: Aug. 22, 29 / Sept. 12, 19, 26 / Oct. 3, 10)

Homework Club (Grades 1-12)

Cost: \$90

Homework Club provides a quiet atmosphere for students to do homework. Individual help is available when needed.

Private Music Lessons (Grades 3-12)

Maximum Enrollment: 3

Half-hour lessons are offered on the keyboard, guitar, bass, and drums. Student will be in Homework Club before and after their lesson on their chosen day at no extra cost. *No voice lessons.

Make a Video Game Club (Grades 6-12)

Maximum Enrollment: 8

Students will use MIT's Scratch programming language to program their own games. Students will also learn about simple circuits to create a game controller with Makey Makey. Students will see how math can be useful and fun. **Students interested in this club should be familiar with multiplying and dividing.**

Printmaking Club (Grades 4-12)

Join Ms. Hangauer on Monday afternoons for explorations in printmaking! We'll use gelli plates, make our own stamps and linocuts, and more. Kids will learn about relief, intaglio, planographic, and stencil prints. They'll study work from other artists and find their own inspiration! This is a process-based art club with absolutely no experience necessary.

Bullet Journaling Club (Grades 5-12)

The Bullet Journaling (BUJO) Club is a place where students share layout ideas and supplies and chat about their planning process. What in the world is a Bullet Journal? A "bullet" refers to notebooks or loose paper that has a grid of dots rather than lines. Bullet journaling means creating a customized notebook for yourself that is one part planner, one part to-do-list, and one part journal. Having a Bullet Journal for school is a simple tool that can help with anxiety, time management, and organization. Bullet Journaling is a great way to use your creativity to track your assignments, improve your memory, manage stress, and achieve your goals. *Students are welcome to bring a journal they are already using or wait to learn more before they purchase. A list of different types of journals with cost and availability will be provided at the first meeting. A limited number of journals will be available for purchase during club meetings. Fourth grade student participation is by invitation only. Students with fine motor struggles may become frustrated with club tasks.*

Public speaking is a skill for students that takes practice. Students will have the opportunity to strengthen their performance and rhetoric in a judgment-free environment. A focus on the science of movement and tension will give students the tools they need to tackle stage-fright. A small-group setup allows practice in both speaking in front of others, and developing thoughtful, productive feedback as an audience member. Students should bring a water bottle to each session.

Students will take on the role of fantasy characters in the game world and use teamwork, problem solving, math, and strategy to explore and survive in a dangerous dungeon. Students can play as almost any character they can think of like a dastardly pirate, brilliant wizard, or mischievous spy. Throughout the quarter, students will fill their very own sketchbook with different drawing prompts each week. Exploring diversity in artistic media, they will work in graphite, charcoal, pastels, and more!

Painting Club (Grades 5-12) Maximum Enrollment: 10 Cost: \$155

In our painting club, students will have the opportunity, materials and time to do just that; to paint! Each meeting will be a blend of studio time and individualized instruction, so that students have the freedom to create what they'd like, while still receiving any guidance they may need. They will have the option of working with different types of paint, and will be introduced to many of the artistic movements and genres that have inspired painters for centuries.

Fridays (7 meetings: Aug. 19, 26 / Sept. 9, 16, 23, 30 / Oct. 7)

After-Care (Grades 1-12) Cost: \$90

After-care provides a place for students to do homework or guided activities.

Garage Band (Grades 4-12) Maximum Enrollment: 12 Cost: \$660 (Cost for full year)

All students wishing to play in the band must be enrolled in private lessons here at school or elsewhere.

Don't worry if you are a beginner. Everyone is welcome! **This is a full year commitment.**

Life Science Club (Grades 1-12) Maximum Enrollment: 10 Cost: \$110

In this club, kids will get to explore many aspects of our living world. By exploring the outdoor raised bed gardens and the indoor hydroponic garden, they'll learn about ecosystems and food webs. Students will also get to use real science tools like microscopes and dissecting kits to study living things more closely.

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
